| Tops:     | <ul> <li>Any School appropriate top</li> <li>No undergarments should be visible</li> <li>Tank tops are allowed, but no spaghetti straps</li> <li>Crop tops should not show more than 3 inches of midsection</li> <li>Hoods from sweatshirts may not be worn at any time</li> </ul>  |

| Bottoms:  | <ul> <li>All students must wear bottoms that fully cover undergarments (no parts of underwear or undershorts can be showing)</li> <li>Ripped jeans/pants are allowed, but if rips are located mid-thigh or higher, tights must be worn underneath jeans</li> <li>Skirts and shorts must be length of fingertips when arms are stretched out</li> </ul>  |
| Shoes:    | • Students must wear closed-toed shoes.  Shoes must be completely over the foot according to Finn Scientific lab guidelines. Therefore, no sandals, slides, or slippers are allowed. Crocs must be worn in sport mode.  |
| Headwear: | <ul> <li>Headcoverings (beanies, bonnets, and du rags, baseball caps) are allowed.         However, head coverings cannot cover or hide a student's face or ears unless it's for religious reasons.</li> <li>Ski masks are prohibited from being worn at all times on campus</li> </ul>   |
| Other:    | <ul> <li>Text on Clothing/jewelry that promotes violence, alcohol, gangs, tobacco, drugs, or presents a sexual statement, explicit or implicit, is not allowed.</li> <li>If clothing is determined to be inappropriate or distracting, DSST staff have the right to withhold the clothing item and return it to the student/family at the end of the day.</li> <li>Bandanas of any color are not allowed to be worn or visible throughout the day.</li> </ul> |

## **DSST Cole High School Technology Policy**

We believe High School students are capable of handling responsibility and distractions of technology throughout the day. Students are expected to have cell phones and headphones stored away during class time and community meetings.

They are permitted to be used during transitions and at lunch.
